Covid positive Member coming onsite	Infection	Staff, Members and visitors	If a member comes on site with Covid 19 symptoms, they will be isolated until they can be collected and returned home. Members returning to the project will be screened to assess whether they have had or are showing symptoms of Covid 19 and only allowed to return when they have been assessed as being low risk of having covid 19 either through isolation or testing.
			Information and regular contact by staff with members and carers will provide information and guidance on the signs and symptoms as well as conditions for returning to heathlands.
Staff with Covid symptoms		Staff,	All staff are briefed on latest symptoms and guidance as to self isolation if symptomatic (Social Care Workers Advice).
		Members and	Staff to contact managers ASAP who will help coordinate arranging a test.
		visitors	Staff will only be allowed to return to work once the isolation criteria has been met or having tested negative and showing no symptoms.
Someone onsite starts displaying symptoms	infection Staff, Members and visitors	Members and	If someone develops symptoms while on site with Covid 19 symptoms, they will be isolated until they can be collected and returned home.
			Areas of the site that have potentially been used by that individual will be immediately deep cleaned (see en-hanced cleaning procedure).
			Managers will follow up with the individual to see it the symptoms have developed or a

			diagnosis has been made. If it is strongly suspected or diagnosed as Covid 19 Manager will follow the potential Outbreak procedure.
Visitors to Site	Cross infection	Staff and Members	Visitors to the site will be limited where possible in line with current guidance.
			Where this is not possible they will be asked to follow our infection control procedures.
			Movement around the site will be limited to the bare minimum.
			Any person showing symptoms will be asked to leave immediately.
Infections control -	infection	Staff, Members and visitors	Catch It, Bin It, Kill It posters will be put up around the site.
environmental cross contamination			Everyone will be reminded to cover their cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in a bin then wash hands or use hand gel.

Confirm Covid 19 outbreak on site or Track and Trace Alert	Business interruption/ risk to individual through loss of support	Members	The Outbreak Contingency plan will come into place. Managers will liaise with ASC, other agencies/orgs and families to ensure disruption and distress to members is minimised.
Clinically vulnerable Staff	Higher risk of severe illness	Individual	Staff who fall into these categories will work from home or be furloughed. They will not return to work until government advice changes. They will only be allowed to return once an individual risk assessment has been done with the employee and any relevant medical advice.
Clinically vulnerable Members	Higher risk of severe illness	Individual	Members who fall into this category will only return after risk assessment and discussion with carer, medical professional and social workers.
